

Fundamentals & Ethics of Trauma Treatment

With increased awareness of trauma and resulting client reports, clinicians may find themselves unprepared to effectively help their clients. It is important for clinicians to be prepared for the diagnoses they commonly treat, which now includes trauma-related disorders in many settings. This program will review assessments, diagnostic considerations, and treatment recommendations for trauma-related disorders and symptoms. Common co-occurring disorders/symptoms, such as dissociation, borderline personality disorder, self-injurious behavior, and chronic suicidality, will also be discussed. Clinicians must also be aware of the many ethical considerations specific to working with trauma-related disorders and symptoms including recognizing and addressing transference and attachment issues, minimizing burnout and vicarious trauma, knowing how to manage clients' trauma stories to prevent further trauma, understanding the importance of self awareness and possible consequences of self-disclosure, and more.

- 2. Describe assessment methods specific to trauma-related disorders and symptoms
- 3. Utilize diagnostic specifiers and codes for trauma-related disorders

- 5. Demonstrate use of trauma stabilization skills

Target Audience: This training is designed for professional counselors, school counselors, social workers, marital and family therapists, psychologists, addiction counselors, case managers, nurses, and other health care professionals.
